ISC 4971: Honors Thesis, 3 semester hours

1 Course Overview

The Honors Thesis course fulfills a requirement of the FSU Honors in the Major Program.

In order to complete the FSU Honors in the Major Program, a student must carry out a research thesis in the major area of study under the guidance of a faculty committee, who approve the initial research plan, supervise the ongoing work, and approve the thesis during a final oral defense. A student completing the honors thesis will then graduate “with honors”.

The Honors in the Major Program is modeled after graduate school. The requirements for the thesis include:

- Your thesis work must extend over two or three semesters.
- For each semester of thesis work, you must register for a 3 semester hours of 4000-level honors thesis credit.
- You will choose a committee of at least three faculty members to work with, who are most often tenured or tenure-track; two of the committee members must be from the Department of Scientific Computing, and one from another department.
- Near the beginning of the first term of your thesis work, you will prepare a prospectus, which outlines the topic and the approach of your work, which will be reviewed and approved by your committee.
- You will complete a written document based on your research.
- You will defend your thesis orally before your committee.

Once you have completed and successfully defended your thesis, you will graduate “with honors” in your major, a designation that is noted on your transcript, but not on your diploma.

2 Admission Requirements

If you wish to take the Honors Thesis course, you must first be admitted to the FSU Honors in the Major Program, for which you must meet the following requirements:

- You must have a cumulative FSU GPA of at least 3.200;
- You must have at least 60 hours of college credit;
- There must be at least two full terms before your anticipated graduation;

If you are a transfer student, then:

- You must have been at FSU for at least one full term of 12 semester hours;
- You must have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.200 at FSU and your previous institution.

A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.200 must be maintained in order to remain in the Honors in the Major Program.

3 University Attendance Policy

Consideration will also be given to students whose dependent children experience serious illness.
