- 3. In spring 2021 the FSU graduation will be live, not virtual. This will be President Trasher's final graduation.
- 4. There was a discussion regarding the possibility of having Daniel Schwartz, Associate Professor in Computer Science, join our faculty. Daniel Schwartz is close to retiring. Dr. Schwartz has experience in Artificial Intelligence and could teach some of our discrete courses. This move should not count against our ability to hire a new faculty position.
- 5. There was a discussion of the three types of Master's degrees offered at FSU and in our department. There is a course-based M.S. degree, a project-based degree, and the thesis degree. Karey will explore the details to determine whether the M.S. thesis students are required to meet FSU manuscript deadlines.
